Slow Down, Yield, and Move Over for Emergency Vehicles

To help keep emergency vehicles and highway workers safe, it's important to follow Montana's "Yield -- Slow Down -- Move Over Act". Slowing down, yielding and moving over not only protect lives but also help you avoid financial penalties. Keep reading for reminders about the law.

"Yield -- Slow Down -- Move Over Act" Reminders

- 1. **Slow Down**: Reduce your speed when approaching stationary emergency or law enforcement vehicles with flashing lights.
 - On interstates, slow down by 20 MPH.
 - On state highways or county roads, slow down by 30 MPH.
 - On other roads, slow to half of the posted speed limit if you can't move over.
- 2. **Move Over**: If it's safe, change lanes to avoid driving next to stationary emergency or law enforcement vehicles.
- 3. **Proceed with Caution**: If you can't change lanes, significantly reduce your speed and proceed with extreme caution.
