## **Driving Safety**

## Prevent Distracted and Impaired Driving

Commit to focusing solely on the road while driving; even brief distractions can have devastating consequences.

- Be aware of your surroundings
- Plan ahead and allow extra travel time
- Stay off your cell phone while operating a vehicle
- Drive sober

#### **Signal Your Intentions**

- Signal before turning or changing lanes
- Check your blind spots before making any lane changes
- Use your turn signal even when you don't see any cars around

#### Pedestrian Safety

- Pedestrians generally have the right-of-way
- Yield to pedestrians in crosswalks
- Be extra cautious in areas with heavy foot traffic and be prepared to stop suddenly
- Be mindful of bicyclists and pay attention to the existence of a bike lane

#### **Obey Posted Speed Limits**

- Higher speeds result in greater impact at the time of a crash leading to increased injuries and fatalities
- Stay at least 2 seconds behind the vehicle in front and allow more distance at night or in bad weather

#### Buckle Up

- Seat belts prevent occupants from being tossed on impact
- Seat belts save lives
